The Home Office have threatened the Sukulas, a family of eight asylum seekers from the Congo civil war, with eviction which "may lead to you being separated from your children if...Bolton Social Services is obliged to provide them with accommodation and care."

The Home Office are threatening to take the Sukula children into care.

Mrs Sukula said "I don't want us to be split up... we need people's help...we can't go back to Congo it is really dangerous there."

The family have had their benefits removed under section 9 of the 2004 Asylum Act, which is condemned as inhumane by the British Association of Social Workers.

Bolton NUT said "The decision...is a brutal act...over 2000 local people have signed a petition to let the Sukulas stay... We call on the government to reverse this brutal policy immediately and Bolton Council to provide for the family as a whole in the best interests of the children." 10 local councils have demanded a review of section 9. Make your opposition to this outrage clear. Join us.
